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

Cycle of Works and your F.A.C.E

Sometimes you can discover if you are on the Cycle of Grace or Cycle of Works through looking at your F.A.C.E. The Cycle of Works F.A.C.E. can look like this:

- Fears
- Attachments
- Control
- Entitlements



Fears

What am I afraid of and where does that fear come from?

If this doesn't change, where will it lead me?



What do I clinging to?

Any ideas I can't let go of?

Are there any habits I am inappropriately attached to?



Control

Are there situations where I am trying to exert too much control?

Am I trying to control people, organisations, events or outcomes in an obsessive way?



Entitlements

An entitlement is something I think I deserve.

Do I have ideas of entitlement which are inappropriate?

I've worked hard so I have the right to be rude to my work colleagues.

I have the right to feel sorry for myself because of failure or criticism.



Cycle of Grace and your F.A.C.E.

- Freedom
- Abundance
- Compassion
- Effectiveness
